Raku Firing Demonstration by Bob Sear

GLCAC, with the help of **Thrivent Financial**, held a Raku firing demonstration by **Bob Sear (thanks Bob!)** at the Art Center. Twenty-three people attended the event. Bob used his home-made Raku kiln, fired by a blow torch, to fire several different firings of pieces made by members of the pottery studio and himself. The process of kiln firing, followed by placing the pieces in a small, lidded tin waste can of burning newspapers and ending by placing the pieces in water was held on the new patio. After the demonstration, participants had lunch. Drawings were held for the fired pieces. Everyone took home a unique piece of pottery, as well as learned about this unique technique of pottery firing. Thank you to **Pam Beeson** for preparing the food and ordering the supplies and to **Ray Lovell** for helping us out with extra fire bricks. Thanks to everyone who helped to glaze and make pieces to fire.

Breath



Those wanting to sell their art (jury into the sales gallery) should have their own supplies, pottery studio, and kiln.

With that being said, any member or person who has taken at least one hand-building class or wheel-throwing class and wants to make pottery for their personal use may fire independently made work at the art center. 

Old Business:

- The August 16, 2023 Committee Chairperson meeting was a success
