New Look for the GLCAC Flower Pot this year: Doing our Part to Save the Monarchs

Our favorite flower pot tender, **Dan Fitzgerald**, will be planting the flowerpot with monarchs in mind this summer, in an effort to support the mayor's pledge...

Main Street manager **Mary Jones** spoke to the council regarding "**Mayors' Monarch Pledge**." Jones said that she has spoken with different businesses, groups, and people in trying to formulate a plan.

"They brought up concerns with the way downtown was perceived, the landscaping in particular (and) ways that we could get the community to be more involved," Jones told the council. "What we came up with is to take three of those downtown planted flower beds and support native pollinator plants to support native pollinators, like our state insect, the Monarch butterfly."

Jones said that the normal Monarch butterfly migration path through Illinois follows Route 66, which brings them through the Pontiac area.

Jones also pointed out that the Mayors' Monarch Pledge is a commitment from mayors from across North America to save the Monarch. She stated that the actions already designed meet requirements to sign the pledge and signing the pledge gets international recognition for supporting the Monarch. This was approved 9-0. "I think it's a great idea," Mayor Bill Alvey said. "I'm all in favor!"

April 12, 2023 GLCAC Board Meeting (in brief)

Present: Vickie, Pam, Brenda, Nancy

Absent: Brian, Teresa

Secretary's Report: accepted as presented. Treasurer's Report: balance on hand: \$1,919.85

The following discussions were held:

• Building update expenses are mostly paid, except for Smith's Plumbing. We do not have the final bill yet, but the estimate is \$9,900. Fitzgeralds will loan GLCAC monies needed with no interest, to be paid back as funds come in. The board voted that Pam Beeson will have authority to sign a simple loan agreement for the loan and that the situation will be reviewed in December if GLCAC still owes monies at that time.

• An annual meeting has been rescheduled for July 12. PLEASE MAKE AN EFFORT TO ATTEND.

Two important issues will be addressed: first, continuing issues with filling shifts (as explained below) and discussion regarding current governing structure (as indicated in the outline below).***

- GLCAC will participate in a save the butterfly event on June 3 at Block 59. Help is needed and more information will follow.
- Pam is still researching the right fit for us for a corporate credit card
- Meeting adjourned.

FIRST IMPORTANT ISSUE TO DISCUSS AT THE ANNUAL MEETING: Concern over filling shifts

- There are **54-60 shifts** per month, depending on length of months and extra evening shifts.
- Last year, we had 29 vendors. 5 alternative duties; 5 worked about half of the time, 1 person worked twice, and we average 3-5 people who are unable to work due to illness, surgery, family trips, etc. so, really, we could count on less than 20 people to work shifts.
- As of now, we have 27 members. Right now, several are unable to work due to medical situations. 4 have alternative duties. This is putting a lot of strain on a few people. Please be thinking about this.

SECOND IMPORTANT ISSUE TO DISCUSS AT THE ANNUAL MEETING: Discuss, evaluate, and possibly change governing structure. Items to consider:

- 1. Up until now, there was a need for consistency in personnel while structuring and learning the law. The goals were to:
 - a. Get legal parts in order
 - i. Registering and reporting yearly to
 - 1. Illinois Secretary of State
 - 2. Illinois Revenue Service (nfp)
 - 3. US Revenue Service
 - 4. Illinois Sales Tax Exemption
 - 5. Illinois Property Tax Exemption
 - 6. Insurance
 - 7. Local and state inspections
 - b. Raise funds to make improvements to the building to a point where structural and functional issues are stable and to get those improvements completed.
 - c. Provide a consistent framework for the group to operate and to adhere to that framework



With these things being mostly done, let's talk about how to proceed!
