

Due to time limits and keeping costs down, **Art Attack!** will not include pottery activities (unless you are enrolled in a class on the Art Attack days). Otherwise, just any old other project that you want to do. Please feel free to bring a snack to share (not required).

Gallery Committee News...

The April Show will be a showing of works from the **GLCAC Permanent Collection**, comprised of works that have been donated to GLCAC. Several of the works are by members of the original Amitytown Society of Painters, and most are by local artists.

Special Events

We will be introducing a new event on **April 15: Slow Art Day on Route 66!!** The event was founded in 2010 and is a global event to encourage people to enjoy looking at and appreciating art. Bloomington hosted 9 sites last year and they plan for 15 this year. Our goal at this moment is 3-5 sites.

Slow looking is simply learning through observation. Some works of art may not inspire a sense of connection until you have looked at them and thought about them for a while. Initially a 3-5 minute observing time is suggested. Here are some tips for observing:

- Let your eyes do the work and questions will emerge.
- If the flow stops, close your eyes or look away for a few moments before looking back again.
- You can also change your position to look from a different perspective. What do you see now?
- As you keep looking, you will discover and notice more features and details.

You can Slow Look at art alone or with someone. When you look and discuss with others you will build off the observations they bring up to share. Perhaps you will see something you hadn't noticed before. Some Slow Lookers take notebooks with them to record thoughts in, and/or to sketch in. There is no need for art historical knowledge or art skills in order to participate in Slow Looking.

GLCAC will be one site for Pontiac's Slow Art Day on Route 66 event. The Committee will have some signs in the Joe Bailey Gallery (with a little help from Pam!) with suggestions for how to "Slow Look" while guests

- The GLCAC Permanent Collection Show is in April in the Joe Bailey Gallery. The paintings need to be cataloged and framed. Work date of March 15, 2023 is to scheduled from 10 am to 5 pm.to do this.
- Vickie emailed the sales tax exemption information this week.

While it was mailed in time, it is still missing. (Editor's update: Sales Tax Exemption arrived March 14.)

- Vickie made a motion for the GLCAC Board to apply for acorporate credit card. Brenda seconded. Motion carried.
- Next Board Meeting is April 12, 2023.
